6. Speeding along Meadow Road

'...Even if we could get a few signs indicating pedestrians/animals/horses, that would be an improvement.

The car crash in November was horrendous and 5 households have also had numerous pets killed on the road since I have been here. As a pedestrian, I have had near misses with cars who expect me to use the grass verges, which as we know are uneven, wet and usually muddy/slippery.

As I said the other day, there are a lot of us who use the road, in summary;

8 houses in total

1 of which has a child who walks from gransden when the school bus drops off 3 of which have horses (all of these have to use the road to exercise their horses, in order to get to bridleways)

6 of which have dogs (3 of these use the road to walk dogs)
5 households cycle/run/exercise on the road, two of which have under 18's with
themUnfortunately drivers think/expect us to use the grass verges, which is not possible as
they are steep, uneven and often muddy/slippery. Just a bit more consideration would be
good and may well prevent another accident..'
